Living as God's Child: Remembering God

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn wrote in a 1986 *Reader's Digest* article about going to school in Russia when he was a boy. He told how other children taunted him for going with his mother to the last remaining church in town. He recounted how these children "tore the cross from around my neck." A few years later he remembered older people saying that the explanation for the great disasters that had befallen Russia was, "Men have forgotten God; that's why all this has happened."

Solzhenitsyn wrote:

"Since then I spent well-nigh 50 years working on the history of the Russian Revolution; in the process I have collected hundreds of personal testimonies, read hundreds of books, and contributed eight volumes of my own.

But if I were asked today to formulate as concisely as possible the main cause of the ruinous revolution that swallowed up SOME 60 MILLION OF OUR PEOPLE, I could not put it more accurately than to repeat: 'Men have forgotten God.'"

We have the wonderful privilege of holding the position of Christian steward. It is a position granted by God's grace in creation, in the redeeming sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary's cross, and in the undeserved calling of the Holy Spirit.

One of the dangers Christian stewards face is "forgetting God."
